The Champions Hockey League AG (CHL) is a company established in 2013 in Switzerland that holds all rights of the Champions Hockey League and organises the competition. The CHL is an AG (Aktiengesellschaft = Ltd.) registered in Zug under Swiss Law. As such, the CHL is owned by shareholders and governed by a board that is elected by the CHL General Meeting, the league's legislative body.

The shareholding structure of the company is as follows: **26 Shareholder Clubs:** 63% **6 Shareholder Leagues:** 25% **IIHF:** 12%



SPORT IN BRIEF

The Competition Format

- 32 teams from 13 leagues
- · Teams can only qualify on sporting merits
- A maximum of 5 teams per country
- The CHL Champions are automatically qualified for the next CHL season.
 However, this will not grant one extra place for the league of the CHL winners.

The current format is based on clear and measurable qualification criteria and was successfully launched from the 2017/18 season. Teams have to be the champions, or in the top places of their domestic league to earn a place in the CHL. This format makes not only the Champions Hockey League, but also national leagues, more thrilling. The "race to qualify" culminates at the end of regular seasons and in the playoffs, delivering extra excitement to the fans, media and European club ice hockey.

Participating Leagues

The 2021/22 season will run with the following participating leagues:

- Shareholder Leagues: Austria (ICE), Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Sweden and Switzerland.
- Challenger Leagues: Denmark, France, Norway, Poland, Slovakia, Ukraine, United Kingdom and the IIHF Continental Cup.

The awarding of wild cards to the champions of challenger leagues is subject to formal approval by the CHL board every season.

THE QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

As previously pointed out, teams must earn their place in the CHL on the ice. Teams must achieve one of the following criteria in order to become a CHL contestant:

- 1. CHL champions
- 2. National league champions
- 3. Regular season winners
- 4. Regular season runners-up
- 5. Regular season third-placed team
- 6. Regular season fourth-placed team
- 7. Regular season fifth-placed team

The exceptions to this rule include the United Kingdom, as the EIHL, in line with their tradition, determines their national champion following the regular season (not in the playoffs) and Austria (ICE) who applies the following criteria due to a different playing format:

- 1. National league champions
- 2. Regular season winners
- 3. Pick-round winners
- 4. Pick-round runners-up

<u> COVID-19</u>

Special Circumstances: Impacts on Qualification for the 2021/22 Season As the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic was still seriously affecting society, the economy and sports in spring 2021, there were impacts on European club ice hockey and the qualification to the 2021/22 CHL season:

- As the German DEL changed its playing format for the 2020/21 season due to the pandemic, the following CHL qualification criteria applied for Germany:
 National Champions
 - 2. Group A/B winners with higher PPG (points per game percentage)
 - Group A/B winners with lower PPG (points per game percentage)
 - 4. Group A/B runners-up with higher PPG (points per game percentage)
 - 5. Group A/B runners-up with lower PPG (points per game percentage)
- As the EIHL was forced to cancel the 2020/21 season, the CHL Board decided to award the UK's qualification place to the Cardiff Devils (qualified for CHL in the 2019/20 season)
- As the IIHF Continental Cup did not take place in 2020/21, the CHL Board decided to award its qualification place to the 2019/20 winners SønderyjskE Vojens (DEN)

Additionally, Slovan Bratislava (SVK) were awarded a Wild Card for the 2021/22 season after the place for Belarusian champions Yunost Minsk was withdrawn due to unforeseen circumstances.

ALLOCATION OF PLACES PER NATIONAL LEAGUE

The number of places per national league is allocated with the help of the CHL league ranking. This tool calculates the performance of teams in every CHL season and the better the teams perform, the more qualification places a league can be awarded. However, the six shareholder leagues remain ranked 1 – 6, while all challenger leagues follow in accordance. For 2021/22, the previous four CHL seasons are taken into consideration (weighted 100, 75, 50 and 25 percent – in which the newest season counts the most).

The CHL league ranking after the 2019/20 season was as follows:

According to the CHL League Ranking, each Shareholder League will receive the following number of places in the 2021/22 season:

- 5 places: Sweden and Switzerland
- 4 places: Germany and Finland
- · 3 places: Czech Republic and Austria

The granted place to the 2020 CHL Champions, Frölunda Gothenburg, is included in the 5 qualification places for Sweden.

PLAYING FORMAT

Between August and March, a total of 125 games will be played over the course of 13 game days. Four teams in each of the eight groups will battle in the Group Stage to reach the CHL Playoffs. The top two teams in each group will advance to the Round of 16.

With the exception of the Final, all matchups in the Playoffs will be two-game, home-and-away aggregate scoring series.

COVID-19

Special Circumstances: Final Olympic Qualification Tournament Impact To accommodate the needs of the national teams involved in the Final Olympic Qualification tournament (FOQ), the CHL Board has decided to slightly adapt the draw procedure for the 2021/22 Group Stage Draw.

Eight teams from countries participating in the FOQ were allocated into their own pot (pot no. 5) and drawn into two separate groups of four that will not play their CHL games during the FOQ tournament on the weekend of 26-29 August. The other 24 teams were allocated into four pots and drawn by the standard procedure into six groups of four.

The change of draw procedure due to the FOQ as described above applied for the 2021/22 season only as the FOQ was postponed because of COVID-19.



CHL DISCIPLINARY SYSTEM

The CHL Disciplinary System is based on three tiers.

The core of the CHL Disciplinary System is the Sport Disciplinary Board. It is an independent body appointed by the CHL to control the sport disciplinary process and player safety in the Champions Hockey League.

What is reviewed?

- All match penalties
- All major penalties
- All game misconducts
- · All abuse of official penalties
- All serious situations, regardless of if a penalty has been called

Additionally, the CHL Sport Disciplinary Board may review any other incident referred to it by the Game Supervisor and clubs, or any incident that the Sport Disciplinary Board views as requiring supplementary jurisdiction.

How does the procedure works?

- A disciplinary procedure is opened by the Chairman or a Member of the Sport Disciplinary Board, a Game Supervisor, the CHL Sport Director or a club.
- 2. The Chairman determines that a supplementary jurisdiction case exists.
- The Chairman notifies the members of the Sport Disciplinary Board, and provides all relevant evidence/reports (incl. video footage & written comments) by 13:00 CET the day after the game.
- 4. The Chairman makes a final decision based on received feedback from Sport Disciplinary Board members and notifies the participating club no less than four hours before their next CHL game.

<u>COVID-19</u>

Special Circumstances: COVID-19 Committee


If an extraordinary COVID-19-related issue arises during the 2021/22 CHL season, defined as a situation that is not regulated and/or not clearly defined by the CHL Club Manual (including but not limited to the Sport Regulations, the CHL Casebook & the COVID-19 Guidelines), the case will be reviewed and a decision will be taken by the CHL's COVID-19 Committee.

As a precautionary measure, the CHL has decided prior to the start of the season to use points percentage (points per game played) as the criteria to determine the Group Stage standings. This enables the fair comparison of teams in the event of game cancellations. It should be noted that teams must play at least 50% of their Group Stage in order to have their place in the standings, as decided by points percentage, accepted.

 Preferably, the final decision shall be communicated towards the accused club/player within 24 hours of the incident occurring.

Who is in charge?

The Chairman of the Sport Disciplinary Board is Lyle Seitz, who is appointed by the CHL Board. He, in cooperation with the CHL Sport Director Alex Jäger, is in charge of receiving requests and reviewing incidents, aided by a panel of six people who are highly experienced and well versed with ice hockey, its rules and procedures. All six CHL shareholder leagues are represented in the Sport



Disciplinary Board. The members are not bound by any restrictions and not accountable to anyone for their decisions. Further, the members are known by the CHL Board and the 32 participating clubs, but not named in public.

Where are the games reviewed?

On game days, the CHL operates its own Situation Room in cooperation with the German Ice Hockey League (DEL) and their DEL Game Centre in Neuss (GER). Livestreams of all CHL Games are transmitted to the CHL Situation Room, where all games are monitored live and every incident on the ice is logged by a dedicated person. In addition, a Hockey Operations and Referee Supervisor are assigned for each Game Day. Any notable event on the ice, with or without a call, is tracked, and if deemed worthy of Disciplinary Review, sent to the Sport Disciplinary Board.

Can clubs appeal?

Yes, clubs can appeal a suspension or a decision by the Sport Disciplinary Board if the suspension exceeds three games or a €15,000 fine. In such cases, an appeal to the CHL Justice Board is mandatory prior to an appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS). The appeal shall be submitted in writing within 24 hours after receipt of the Sport Disciplinary Board's decision.

TEAM SECTION

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Sebastian Dahm: The Danish goaltender joined the club in the summer of 2020 and had a very successful first season. He won the ICE Hockey League championship with KAC and was voted the MVP of the regular season. Dahm also set a new club record with twelve shutouts in 2020/21 and started all seven games for Denmark at the 2021 IIHF World Championship.

Thomas Koch: Koch has been one of the most successful products of KAC Klagenfurt's junior program over the last three decades. The veteran has played in 22 seasons, 15 of them for his hometown club. In the 2020/21 season, he recorded his 1,000th point in the Austrian topflight and won the national championship for the 10th time in his career. Before retiring from international hockey in 2014, he represented Austria in eleven World Championship tournaments and one Olympic tournament.

Nick Petersen: Petersen has three seasons for KAC under his belt, finishing as the team's top scorer in two of these seasons. He also has two domestic titles to his name (2019 and 2021). He led all ICE Hockey League players in points in the 2021 playoffs and was named the playoff MVP.

NEW PLAYERS FOR 2021/22

For the first time since 1986, KAC Klagenfurt has not signed a single new player in summer in 2021.

STATEMENTS

Head Coach Petri Matikainen's comments about the team's goals in the Champions Hockey League: "Our club has a rich tradition in European competition, dating back to the 1960s, a time when we were pretty successful. However, in our first three appearances in the CHL, we finished third in our group, so our goal, our dream, will be to finally make it to the CHL Playoffs, the Round of 16, and then take it from there."

Head Coach Petri Matikainen's comments about the other teams in the group:

Rouen Dragons: "Rouen have been a dominant force in French hockey over recent years as they made the domestic league finals five times in a row. Furthermore, they have a few import players on their roster who have played in our league. So, we know that we face an excellent opponent in the Dragons."

Rungsted Seier Capital: "Just like us, Rungsted Seier Capital have won two championships over the past three seasons, so we take on a team that is used to win and full of self-confidence. They have a few internationally experienced players on their team. Facing Rungsted will be particularly special for our goalie Sebastian Dahm as he's the goaltender of the Danish national team."

HC Donbass Donetsk: "HC Donbass Donetsk have been a dominant force in Ukrainian hockey over recent years and won the national championship in five of six years since they had to leave the KHL. Strengthened by import players from neighboring countries like Russia and Belarus, we expect an opponent of high quality that will be tough to play."

CLUB TRIVIA

KAC Klagenfurt was founded as a multisports club in 1909. Ice hockey was introduced to the club in the 1920s and the team played its first game in 1927.

The club is based in Klagenfurt, the capital of Austria's southernmost province Kärnten (Carinthia), which is one of the most popular summer holiday destinations in the country.

In 1933, KAC Klagenfurt became the first Austrian champion from outside of Vienna.

After winning back-to-back titles in 2019 and 2021, the club has now won a total of 32 national championships.

On the international stage, KAC's major accomplishments date back to the 1960s, when the club made it to the semi-finals of the European Cup three years in a row (1966, 1967, 1968), topped by participation in the finals against CSKA Moscow in 1969.

The club's colours (red/white) and crest have been in use and are unchanged since 1920. The team's nickname Rotjacken (Red Jackets) originates from that era as well.

Ice hockey is the most popular sport in both the city of Klagenfurt and the province of Carinthia. However, due to the club's long-standing tradition, KAC Klagenfurt also have fan clubs in major Austrian cities like Vienna or Graz.

Twice, in 2010 and 2015, KAC played home games against their local rivals Villach in the city's football stadium, attracting crowds of 30,500 and 29,700, respectively.

PLAYERS' TRIVIA

KAC Klagenfurt are known for having a strong core of Austrian players and five members of the current roster (**Thomas Koch** 811, **Stefan Geier** 731, **Thomas Hundertpfund** 718, **Manuel Geier** 713, **Martin Schumnig** 707) have played more than 700 league games for the club. The club won the ICE Hockey League title in 2021 despite dressing only an average of 4.9 import players per game throughout the year.

Defenceman **Martin Schumnig** has never represented any club other than KAC Klagenfurt in his entire junior and pro career.

Veteran **Thomas Koch** led all KAC players in total time-on-ice in the 2020/21 season (1147 minutes and 29 seconds). Furthermore, he has dressed in each of KAC's last 228 games (216 domestic games and 12 CHL contests). He has not missed a single game since 20 December 2017.

Canadian **Nick Petersen** led all ICE Hockey League players in scoring in 2020/21, becoming the first KAC player to win this award since Anthony lob in 2003/04.

Klagenfurt native **Thomas Hundertpfund** has played twelve full seasons with KAC, making the playoffs each year.

BEYOND HOCKEY

Despite being based in Austria, KAC Klagenfurt's locker room winning song in the 2020/21 season was the Slovenian classic Ti Moja Rožica, played from the phone of centre **Rok Tičar** and sung by the entire team.

Twin brothers **Manuel** and **Stefan Geier**, both in their 14th season with the club, are very talented as carpenters and like to spend their spare time building pieces of furniture from wood.

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Anton Bernard: Bernard has played for Bolzano since 2008, and he became the team's captain in 2018. He has played 685 games for the club, the most of any player. In 13 seasons with Bolzano, Bernard has won two ICE Hockey League titles, two Italian championships, one Italian Cup, and two Italian Supercups. Nick Plastino: After beginning his career in Canada, Plastino, a skilled puck-moving defenceman, moved to Asiago in Italy in 2007. During four seasons in Italy, Plastino won two titles (in 2010 and 2011) and he was a major player for the club. He also made his debut for the Italian national side during this spell. Plastino returned briefly to the ECHL before signing back in Europe, this time in Sweden. By 2013, Plastino had signed in the SHL with Örebro, spending one season there before switching to the Stavanger Oilers in Norway for the 2014/15 season. During this season, he scored almost a point per game and featured in the CHL. After spending time in Finland (Tappara Tampere), the KHL (Slovan Bratislava), and Swiss NL (HC Ambrì-Piotta), Plastino signed with Bolzano ahead of the 2020/21 season. In a solid debut campaign with the Foxes. Plastino scored 33 points and finished with a plus/ minus of +24.

Mike Halmo: Halmo first made his name with the OHL's Owen Sound Attack, where he played for four years and earned the captaincy role. In 2011/12, he made his pro debut with the AHL's Bridgeport Sound Tigers. Halmo spent the next four seasons in the New York Islanders' system, including a 20-game spell in the NHL, which yielded one goal. In 2016/17, he left to join the Syracuse Crunch, where he scored 28 points in 69 games. Halmo moved across the Atlantic in 2017/18, joining Bolzano. He was a crucial part of the team that went on to win the ICE Hockey League title that year. After two seasons abroad, split between Germany and Finland, Halmo returned to the Foxes in 2020/21. In 122 games for the club, he has amassed 90 points (34 goals and 56 assists).

Assistant Coach Fabio Armani's comments about the team's goals in the Champions Hockey League: "It will be an honor to compete on the European stage. Our goal is to give it our all every game. If we go on the ice with the right mindset, then we can definitely qualify for the next round. This is of course our main goal and it is what the fans expect from us, after being among the 16 best teams in Europe in our last CHL campaign. It will not be easy, because our opponents are tough. We will face this competition with the same team spirit that has always distinguished us, thinking about shift after shift."

Assistant Coach Fabio Armani's comments about the other teams in the group:

Red Bull Salzburg: "They are definitely the opponent we know best in the group. I expect a balanced challenge and a great show, as it has always been in recent years. Like every year, the Red Bulls have prepared a competitive team, ready to fight again for the ICE Hockey League title and to go as far as possible in the CHL. Let's not forget that they reached the Semi-Finals in 2018/19." Frisk Asker: "The Norwegian league is competitive and, while we don't know our opponents well, we know they are talented. They are a team that combines young talent with experienced players, with many Norwegians and some players coming from other countries. It will be fascinating to face them, both at home and away. We have never had the chance to meet a Norwegian team in the CHL before, and it will be a new experience, a different style of hockey that we will have to study on video in order to go on the ice with the right weapons to neutralize them."

JKH GKS Jastrzębie: "As with Frisk Asker, they are new opponents for us. In 2018, we faced a Polish team, GKS Tychy, in the Group Stage and it was not at all easy. In Poland, we lost 5-3, and at Palaonda, they tied the game after trailing 4-0, although we went on to win and secure our place in the Playoffs. I think this shows the spirit of resilience that Polish hockey has, and if JKH GKS Jastrzębie made it all the way to the CHL, they certainly want to do well and get results. We know the goaltender Patrik Nechvatal, who in the past played in Znojmo and Innsbruck, as well as the forward Vitalijs Pavlovs, who spent some time last year with Dornbirn, but overall, it's a good team that can count on many new, experienced players who have played in top leagues such as the KHL. It will be a good challenge."

CLUB TRIVIA

Italy's Record-Breaking Club: Bolzano is the most successful hockey club from Italy. To date, Bolzano has won 19 Italian titles, 2 ICE Hockey League titles, 3 Italian Cups, 4 Italian Supercups, 1 Alpenliga, 1 Six Nations title, and 1 Coppa delle Alpi.

Bolzano won the ICE Hockey League title in 2013/14, the first season the team played in the multi-nation league, and this was followed up by a second title in 2017/18. During the latter season, Bolzano were bottom of the league in December.

Bolzano are still the only ICE Hockey League team not based in Austria to win the league.

During the team's final seasons in the Italian league structure, attendance at games fluctuated between 600 and 1,000. However, ice hockey is in the DNA of the Bolzanini, and with the move to the ICE Hockey League, more than 3,000 fans attend regular season games, with this figure exceeding 6,000 in the playoffs. During the finals, Bolzano very often sells out the team's 7,200-attendance arena.

Fans: Bolzano has the best fans in the ICE Hockey League. They are our seventh man and they cheer and sing all game, whether at home or on the road. They congregate in the "curva," located in sectors D and H of the Palaonda, and are called the Figli di Bolzano. We also have a fan club, named HCBfans.

#33: The number 33 is very important in Bolzano's history. Not only does it denote the year in which the club was founded (1933), but also because it was worn by a Foxes' legend, **Gino Pasqualotto.** The number 33 is the only one to be retired by the club, and the city of Bolzano recently decided to rename our arena Pala33.

PLAYERS' TRIVIA

Dustin Gazley played for Red Bull Salzburg in the 2018/19 season, including their CHL campaign. This year, he will also play against his former teammates in the CHL Group Stage. Fun fact: Gazley scored nine points in six games against his former team last season.

Anton Bernard, Marco Insam and Daniel Frank are the only players to have played in each of Bolzano's 14 CHL games to date.

Nick Plastino has already played in the CHL for three different teams (Stavanger Oilers in 2014/15, Tappara Tampere in 2015/16, HC Ambrì-Piotta in 2019/20)

With 11 points, **Marco Insam** is Bolzano's top scorer in the CHL. Interesting fact: all 11 of his points are goals!

Ten Bolzano players are members of the Italian national team. At this season's IIHF World Championship in Riga, **Daniel Frank** captained the Azzurri for the first time.

On 5 September, 2014, HCB's first two goals in the CHL were scored by **Anton Bernard** (HC Bolzano – TPS Turku 4-2)

Our captain **Anton Bernard** is very active with many projects that aim to publicize sports in our area. He is also a representative of AIDO, the Italian association for the donation of organs, tissues and cells.

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Thomas Raffl: Raffl is one of the Red Bulls' longest serving players and is regularly one of the team's top scorers. Standing 1.93 meters tall and with a great physique, the 35-year-old forward stands out with his physical style of play. He has captained the team for the last two seasons after joining in 2011. He spent one year away in North America in 2015/16 after being awarded a NHL contract with the Winnipeg Jets. With 22 goals (incl. playoffs), Raffl was also the Red Bulls' top scorer last season.

Ty Loney: Loney is an American forward who came to Austria from North America three years ago and impressed from the beginning in the ICE Hockey League. In the 2018/19 season with the Graz99ers as well as in the last two seasons with the Vienna Capitals, the 29-year-old was always among the top scorers in the league. Last season was his best in the pan-European league so far with 27 goals and 21 assists in 44 regular season games as well as an incredible 10 goals and 6 assists in 10 playoff games with the Capitals.

TJ Brennan: TJ Brennan was under contract in the NHL for several seasons and was one of the American Hockey League's (AHL) most offensively strong defencemen for many years. The 32-yearold American was drafted in the 2nd round in 2007 by the Buffalo Sabres, for whom he played a total of 21 games from 2011 to 2013. In total, Brennan played in 53 NHL games for three clubs, scoring 13 points (5 goals and 8 assists). Brennan also played 679 regular season games in the AHL, scoring a total of 478 points He finished as the AHL's top scoring defenceman three times, and he is a five-time AHL all-star. Brennan moved to Europe for the first time in his career last season, where he played for Swiss club HC Thurgau, and scored the most goals of any defenceman in the regular season.

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Andrew Desjardins: The 35-year-old Desjardins made the leap to the NHL as an undrafted player. After impressing in the OHL, the left shot made his debut in the AHL for the Worcester Sharks in 2008/09. The versatile forward finally made his NHL debut on 3 January 2011. Desjardins played in a total of 461 NHL games for the San Jose Sharks and Chicago Blackhawks, scoring 26 goals and 46 assists. He celebrated winning the Stanley Cup with the Blackhawks in 2015. Desjardins has also played well in Mannheim, forming a threatening attacking line alongside David Wolf and Matthias Plachta. Since 2017, Desjardins has played in 164 games for the Adler in the DEL, scoring 55 goals and 67 assists.

Korbinian Holzer: Holzer was just 19 years old when he made his DEL debut in a Düsseldorfer EG jersey in 2007. The defenceman, who was drafted 111th overall in the fourth round by the Toronto Maple Leafs in 2006, laced up his skates for the "Rheinländer" for three seasons before he tested himself in North America. The Munich native played 211 NHL games in eight seasons for the Maple Leafs, Anaheim Ducks and Nashville Predators. Holzer scored six goals and assisted on 21 others. Between 2010 and 2020, he also played 332 games in the AHL, recording 15 goals and 77 assists.

David Wolf: Wolf played in Mannheim during his junior career. As a result, the robust forward feels like a native of Mannheim, even though he was born in Düsseldorf. At the age of 20, Wolf played his first DEL season for Hannover. After a strong 2013/14 season for the Hamburg Freezers with 52 points from 58 games, Wolf tried his luck in the NHL a year later. He played four games for the Calgary Flames, but remained pointless and initially returned to Hamburg in 2015. In 2016, he joined the Adler, for whom he has collected 175 points so far.

CLUB TRIVIA

Our mascot is a hamster, which is named Udo, like the former announcer of the club during home games. Why a hamster? Because a specific species of hamster comes from the area where the SAP Arena was built in 2003. During the construction of the SAP Arena, the hamsters had to be relocated and the SAP Arena decided to introduce the hamster as the mascot.

Hockey in the city of Mannheim was first established in 1938, when Mannheimer ERC (MERC) first took the ice. MERC won their first German championship in 1980.

In 1994, ice hockey in Mannheim experienced some changes when Adler Mannheim was founded from MERC and joined Germany's newly founded professional league, the DEL, the same year.

The Adler quickly became a success, both on and off the ice. Adler Mannheim have

collected eight championships, made an additional three finals appearances, and won Germany's Pokal-Cup twice. Since 2005, the club has played all its home games in front of a loyal fan base inside SAP Arena, with a seating capacity of 13,600.

Adler, along with their loyal fans, have helped Mannheim earn the nickname Hockey Town. Adler proudly has the most successful junior project in the DEL: Adler's junior team has collected 16 championships in the DNL, Germany's best youth league.

Adler Mannheim founded the non-profit and charitable organisation "Adler helfen Menschen e.V." in 2007, to help distressed and needy people. In the name of the non-profit organisation the club organizes many different charity events during the season, for example the game of the flashing hearts right before Christmas. With those events and the help of donors, the organisation collected close to one million euros for non-profit purposes.

PLAYERS' TRIVIA

Import **Borna Rendulić** became a part of Croatian sports history, as the first hockey player that began his career in Croatia and signed a contract with a NHL club.

Head coach **Pavel Gross** is the first person to ever win the domestic title with Adler Mannheim as both a player and a coach.

With **Dennis Endras**, **Sinan Akdag**, **Matthias Plachta** and **David Wolf**, the Adler have four silver medal winners from the 2018 Winter Olympics in their roster. **Nigel Dawes** is the most successful non-Russian scorer in KHL history. His 550 points are the fifth most ever in the league. His 293 goals are the second most of any KHL player in history.

Also in 2010, Munich made ice hockey history by being part of the world's longest penalty shootout to date, which Munich lost to the Straubing Tigers after the 42nd penalty shot.

Four years after Munich's first Champions Hockey League game, **Konrad Abeltshauser** scored the club's 100th CHL goal against HC05 Banská Bystrica in August 2019.

Other facts:

Red Bull Munich have played in special Oktoberfest jerseys for several years now, to pay tribute to the city's famous beer festival and so-called fifth season.

Jan Urbas: Tall, sure-footed, with excellent skating skills and a huge heart, Jan Urbas has given the Penguins the boost they have needed to become regular participants in the DEL playoffs. Jan Urbas first made his name as a junior in Slovenia for Olimpija Ljubljana but continued his hockey education in Sweden with the Malmö Redhawks. He found his way to Bremerhaven after successful spells with the Växjö Lakers, Red Bull Munich, KAC Klagenfurt, VIK Västerås HK, and Villacher SV.

Jan Urbas has captained the Slovenian national team on more than one occasion, scoring seven points in three games in Olympic pre-qualification action two years ago. He also represented his country at the Winter Olympics in 2014 and 2018.

Mike Moore: The face of the Penguins. Now 34 years of age, the 185cm left-shot defenceman came to Bremerhaven five years ago after racking up 467 games in the AHL and six games in the NHL with the San Jose Sharks. Moore joined the Penguins as a relative unknown, but few can doubt his contribution to the team, which he now captains, over the past few years. Moore is a prototypical shutdown defenceman who goes into the dirty areas and prides himself on his consistency.

Dominik Uher: Dominik Uher is a tough, strong skater who is excellent in both ends of the ice. A mixture of Czech skill and North American grit, he is exactly the sort of player the Penguins have needed to survive in the DEL, a league that is increasing in quality each year. Uher's strong puck skills have made him an indispensable part of the Penguins' second line, where he features alongside Tye McGinn and Alex Friesen.

Jan Kovář: Kovář won the Czech championship in 2013 with HC Pilsen and then moved to top Russian club Metallurg Magnitogorsk, winning the Gagarin Cup in 2014 and 2016. In 2018/19, he tried his hand with the New York Islanders and Providence Bruins before returning to his home club HC Pilsen for the rest of the season. In his second season in Zug, he played 65 games and scored 78 points, which earned him the Swiss NL's top scorer award.

Leonardo Genoni: Standing 182 cm tall and weighing in at 87 kg, Genoni made his debut with ZSC Lions Zurich in 2003, before moving to HC Davos in 2007. With Davos, Genoni won three Swiss titles and two Spengler Cups. In 2016, he signed a three-year contract with SC Bern, where he won the title in 2019 after winning 4-1 against EVZ in the playoff final. Genoni joined EV Zug in 2018/19, signing a fiveyear contract. Last season's title win was his sixth Swiss championship.

Anton Lander: The 30-year-old joined Zug from Lokomotiv Yaroslavl (KHL), for whom he played the past two seasons. Before that, the Swedish international played two seasons with Ak Bars Kazan, with whom he won the Gagarin Cup in 2018. In total, Lander played 235 games (60 goals, 86 assists) in the KHL. Lander was drafted by the Edmonton Oilers in 2009, and went on to play 215 games in the NHL, scoring 10 goals and adding 25 assists. He also scored more than 170 points in 203 AHL games.

Philipp Neuenschwander: 15 seasons at EVZ and top scorer in 1983. The dangerous winger scored 222 goals for EVZ in 546 games. The former EVZ junior spent two years at HC Davos (1986–88) and played 51 games for the Swiss national team. Between 2001 and 2004, the longtime captain was sports manager for EVZ.

Patrick Fischer: 10 seasons at EVZ, twotime top scorer. Won championships with Lugano and Davos but is still regarded as an EVZ legend. Iced in 181 games for the national team. He came back to EVZ at the same time as Sean Simpson (from Hamburg) in 2003, twice led the team in scoring and was the first EVZ player to make it into the NHL (Phoenix Coyotes, 2006) and the KHL (SKA St. Petersburg, 2007). Currently, he is the head coach of the Swiss national team.

André Künzi: The long-time national team defenceman came from Bern to Zug in 1990 and was one of the leading figures in the EVZ defence for over a decade. After his first title in 1989 with SC Bern, he won the championship for the second time with EVZ in 1998. In total, Künzi played in Zug for 12 seasons. In 2001, he had to retire due to injuries.

Fabian Schnyder: After 17 seasons with EVZ, the long-time captain (2012–16) ended his career after the 2019/20 season having played in 873 games. Schnyder only ever played for Zug and won the Swiss Cup in 2019. Schnyder also played 33 games in the CHL, qualifying for every season with EVZ.

EVZ means Eissportverein Zug. EVZ is the only club in Switzerland with Eissportverein in its name, which makes it unique.

Julien Sprunger: Sprunger is a local player who was trained at Fribourg-Gottéron, where he made his debut in the NL during the 2002/03 season and where he still plays. He was drafted by the Minnesota Wild in 2004 in the 4th round. He is the captain of the team since 2010. On 14 December 2020, Julien Sprunger wrote his name in history by becoming the club's all-time scorer. The captain has registered 652 points with the club to date, one more than legendary Russian forward Slava Bykov. There's more to come this season.

Until 1983, Lausanne's home arena was the same building that opened in 1937. The rink, which had a capacity of 8,000, did not have a roof until 1978.

The "virage ouest" (west curve), in reference to the position of the home fans in the old Malley rink (1983–2017), is famous for its loud and constant support.

During the 1978/79 season, the head coach of Arosa, then Switzerland's top team, called Lausanne "pigs". At the next LHC-Arosa game, the home fans put pigs' feet – fresh from the butcher – on the Arosa bench. One of the favourite songs of Lausanne's Section Ouest fan group is based on the Michael Jackson hit You Are Not Alone. They also sing a song about how they love their club more than their significant others or happy hour at the bar.

During the 2004/05 NHL lockout, Canadian superstar Martin St. Louis played with LHC. He left before the end of the season because his wife was expecting a baby, and Lausanne were relegated from the Swiss NL that season.

Swiss tennis star Stan Wawrinka was a board member of the club for five years up to 2015. Swiss tennis champion Timea Baczinczky is a big fan and regularly attends home games. Both were born in Lausanne.

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Joel Lundqvist: The team's captain and one of the most prominent players in the club's history. He went through Frölunda's youth development program (academy) and made his debut for the first team as an 18-year-old in 2000. He is a four-time Swedish champion (2003, 2005, 2016, 2019), four-time CHL champion (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020) and three-time world champion (2006, 2013, 2017). He also played three seasons in the NHL for the Dallas Stars (2006–2009) and is the twin brother of legendary goalie Henrik Lundqvist.

Ryan Lasch: The wizard from Orange County returns to Frölunda for the second time. He was one of the key players when Frölunda won the double (SHL and CHL) in 2019 and was named the most valuable player after the club's fourth CHL title in 2020. Christian Folin: It's been a long journey home for defenceman Christian Folin. He went through Frölunda's academy before moving to the United States. After impressing in the junior leagues and the college system, Folin fulfilled his dream and became an NHL player for the Minnesota Wild, icing in a total of 244 NHL games. In 2020, he moved back to Sweden and won the Swedish championship with the Växjö Lakers in 2021. Christian Folin is a tough and solid defenceman with a decent shot.

Maciej Urbanowicz: Captain and forward of JKH GKS Jastrzębie and the Polish national team. He was born on 12 July 1986, in Gdańsk, but spent most of his career with JKH GKS Jastrzębie (2009– 2015 and again from 2019 till now). With our club, he has won one Polish title and three Polish Cups, along with a Polish Super Cup and Visegrad Cup title. An interesting fact is that his father is Janusz Urbanowicz, one of the most successful Polish rugby players.

Urbanowicz is a real team captain. He rules the locker room and the ice, but leads the team not as a boss, but as the leader on the frontlines who sets an example for his younger teammates. The popular "Urban" never gives up and his ability to play through injury is legendary.

Roman Rac: The club's Slovak goal-scoring machine. He was born on 28 December 1990, in Dubnica nad Vahom, and he made his national team debut in 2014/15. For almost his entire career, he plied his trade in the Czech Republic and Slovakia but moved to Poland late in the 2019/20 season. After a brief spell in Gdańsk, Rac joined JKH GKS Jastrzębie before the 2020/21 season.

Rac, who has a contract until 2023, was instrumental in winning the triple crown (Polish Ekstraliga, Polish Cup and Polish Super Cup), and in addition he was the main hero of the Polish Cup final against Unia Oświęcim (3-2), in which he scored the second goal and assisted on the third.

Patrik Nechvatal: A super reliable goaltender from the Czech Republic. He was born on 8 July 1992, starting his career at HC Karlovy Vary. He has experience from the Czech Republic, France, and Slovakia, and joined JKH GKS ahead of the 2020/21 season.

Nechvatal is remarkably calm on the surface. This feature, rarely seen in goaltenders, allows him to avoid costly mistakes. The Czech shotstopper's top qualities are his reliability and reflexes. THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Kristers Gudlevskis: The Latvian goaltender, born in 1992, joined Slovan in February 2021. He was selected in the 2013 NHL Entry Draft by the Tampa Bay Lightning and is the only player in history to have played in the ECHL, AHL, NHL, Olympic Games and IIHF World Championships in the same season (2013/14). He made his first NHL start on 11 April 2014 for the Lightning, stopping 36 shots in a 3-2 win against the Columbus Blue Jackets. At the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi, Kristers got the start for Latvia in the country's quarter-final matchup against Canada, saving 55 of 57 shots. He helped Latvia stay alive until late into the third period, eventually falling in a 2-1 loss. In the 2021/22 season, he is expected to be a starting goalie for Slovan.

Michal Sersen: The 35-year-old defenceman is the long-time captain of Slovan, where he began his professional career in 2002. He has played 14 seasons for Slovan so far and only needs to ice eight more times to become the all-time franchise leader in games played. As a solid defenceman, Sersen helped Slovan win three Slovak titles and he played for Slovan in all seven seasons of the club's KHL tenure. In 2012, he was a member of the Slovak national team that won the silver medal at the IIHF World Championship in Helsinki.

Brant Harris: Brant is a Canadian forward who has been with Slovan since the start of the 2020/21 season. He previously played in the NCAA, ECHL, AHL, Allsvenskan and ICE Hockey League. Last season, Harris was the club's first-line center and finished the season as Slovan's third top scorer, averaging more than a point per game. Of all the players on the current roster, he has the most CHL experience. For his previous club Red Bull Salzburg, he played 20 games in the CHL, scoring 17 points.

CLUB TRIVIA

History

Slovan Bratislava was founded in December 1921 and played their first official game on 29 January 1922. Consequently, the club will celebrate its centenary during the 2021/22 season.

The original name of the club was 1. ČsŠK Bratislava which meant First Czechoslovak Sports Club Bratislava. The name of the club was changed in 1948 to Slovan Bratislava, and this has remained to this day. Slovan means "A Slav" or "Slavic" in the Slovak language.

For many years following World War II, Slovan Bratislava was the only Slovak ice hockey club in the Czechoslovak top tier federal league. They achieved many second place finishes in the championship, and finally won their first and only Czechoslovak title in 1979.

The traditional nickname of the club is Belasí (The Skyblues). Surprisingly enough, Slovan only rarely had played in this colour, their common players kit includes navy blue, white and burgundy red.

The Slovaks play their home games in Ondrej Nepela Arena, a 10,000+ all-seat arena, the venue of the IIHF 2011 and 2019 World Championships. The arena was built in 1940 and completely rebuilt between 2009 and 2011.

Slovan is one of only a few European hockey clubs that have two of their former players inducted in to the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto. Peter Šťastný was inducted in 1998 and Václav Nedomanský was inducted in 2019. There are six Slovan players inducted in the IIHF Hall of Fame.

Slovan have had the privilege to play two games against NHL teams. In 2008 vs. Tampa Bay Lightning (2-3 SO), in 2011 vs. New York Rangers (1-4).

Mascot

Since 2013, Slovan's official mascot is Harvy the Eagle. The name was determined by the team's fans in a public poll. Harvy is a bald eagle, representing the club's logo.

Fans

Slovan boast one of the biggest and most enthusiastic hockey fan bases in the region of East-Central Europe. Their official fan club is called Verní Slovanu. During most of their KHL seasons, Slovan were able to sell out their 10,000+ home arena each game and ranked among Europe's top 10 clubs in terms of average attendance.

Players and fans alike have fallen in love with Slovan's "bearded twins" Robert and L'udovít, who never missed a single game. One of the pair always had a Slovan logo painted on his beard; the other had the opponent's logo. The jumbotron would always pan to them during games, with ZZ Top's Sharp Dressed Man playing in the background. Sadly, Robert died of complications related to COVID-19 earlier this year.

Slovan's most prestigious fan is Swiss tennis player Belinda Bencic, who is ranked #11 in the world. Her grandfather, who came from Bratislava, played for Slovan at the turn of the 1960s and 1970s.

Rivalries

While competing in the federal Czechoslovak league, Slovan's main rivals were Kometa Brno and Sparta Prague. In the Slovak Extraliga, Slovan have fierce rivalries with HC Košice and Dukla Trenčín. During their short spell in the KHL, Lev Prague developed a short-lived rivalry with Slovan, mainly due to the heated public debate over the legality of a hit by Zdeno Chara (Lev Prague) on Slovan legend Miroslav Šatan.

Traditions & rituals

The legendary Zamboni man at Ondrej Nepela Arena, Jozef Brezina, inserts a lucky coin under the faceoff circle in the neutral zone before the ice is laid down ahead of the season. After each victory, Slovan players kneel around the centre-ice circle and only stand up as the fans sing the famous song Go West by the Pet Shop Boys.

PLAYERS' TRIVIA

Michal Sersen – Slovan's captain – needs to play in just eight more games to become the club's all-time leader in games played. He is also the only IIHF World Championship medal holder from Slovan's current roster (silver in 2012).

Six players from the current Slovan roster have previously iced in the Champions Hockey League playing for seven different clubs from Slovakia, Czech Republic, Finland, Austria, Italy and France.

Centre **Brant Harris** has the most Champions Hockey League experience of all current Slovan players. For his previous club, Red Bull Salzburg, he played 20 games in the competition, scoring 17 points.

Combined, the players on Slovan's current roster have only played 4 games in the NHL, but over 800 in the KHL and 83 in the IIHF World Championship.

In CHL's Group F, Slovan will meet three players who had recently played for the team. They all are on Oceláři Třinec's roster: **Tomáš Kundrátek**, **Marek Mazanec**, and **Vladimír Dravecký**.

Slovan has a long tradition of supporting local and national children's cancer associations.

Slovan's game worn jersey auctions are always a special treat for collectors. The most expensive Slovan game worn jersey ever auctioned is that of team captain Michal Sersen for €3,752, followed by jerseys of **Miroslav Šatan, Ľubomír Višňovský** and **Jonathan Cheechoo**.

Some Slovan players are passionate fishermen. While **Tomáš Zigo** and **Juraj Valach's** big catches come from the Slovak lakes, **William Rapuzzi's** biggest catch comes from his native Alaska.

Defenceman **Martin Štajnoch** is a tough player who turns into a passionate painter off the ice in private.

There are several pet lovers among Slovan players, such as **Andrew Yogan** and **Joona Jääskeläinen**.

Rasto Gašpar, the best scoring forward of the 2020/21 season, is a talented imitator entertains the locker room by imitating famous Slovak celebrities. After his hockey career, he would like to have his own TV show.

Forward **Tomáš Matoušek** has a reputation of a tough man on the ice. In private, he is obsessed by having his car absolutely clean at all times.

It seems that the team's captain **Michal Sersen** has taken care of the continuity of his name in Slovan. His two sons Michal (10 yrs.) and Mateo (6 yrs.) excel in Slovan's youth program. Recently, he has also made his video debut in a video clip of a famous local rapper.

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Brendan Mikkelson: This will be Mikkelson's first year with the Devils. Mikkelson was drafted 31st overall by the Anaheim Ducks in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft. He would then go on to play 5 years in the NHL. In 2015, Mikkelson left North America and signed in the SHL with Luleå Hockey, where he stayed for 3 years. Mikkelson then joined the Devils' CHL opponent Adler Mannheim in the DEL. In 47 games with Mannheim, he put up 14 points. Mikkelson would then go and play in the ICE Hockey League and Allsvenskan for Red Bull Salzburg and MODO respectively.

Mac Carruth: This will be Carruth's first season with the Devils. Carruth's career started with the Portland Winterhawks in the WHL. In 2012/13 with the Winterhawks, he became a WHL champion. Carruth's North American pro career was split in the AHL and ECHL with the affiliates of the Chicago Blackhawks. In 2017, Carruth left North America and joined Fehervar in the ICE Hockey League, spending two seasons in Hungary before joining Lausitzer Fuchse in the DEL2 where he played for the last two seasons.

Brodie Dupont: Dupont is another new face to the Devils roster. He was drafted by the New York Rangers in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft and he would go on to play only one game in the NHL. The past three seasons Dupont has played in Europe, in 2018 he joined Dornbirner EC in the ICE Hockey League, putting up 35 points in 51 games. Dupont would then go and sign in Denmark for the Herning Blue Fox where he has played for the past two years.

LEGENDARY PLAYERS IN THE CLUB

Doug McEwen (#7 retired for the Devils): Doug McEwen is widely regarded as one of, if not the most, talented Devils ever to ice for the club. Hugely skilled and an effortless skater, "MC" could change and win games with his relentless backchecking, prolific scoring ability and total reliability in all situations. So revered was McEwen that during the Heineken era he acquired the nickname "God" from the Devils faithful. Most famous for the "skating lesson goal" when he led a chasing, hapless Rocky Saganiuk twice around the Cardiff net before leaving him for dead, skating coast to coast and roofing the puck in possibly the greatest ever Devils goal, Doug McEwen will always be a true legend of the club and synonymous with our most successful era.

John Lawless (#9 retired for the Devils):

John Lawless is quite simply the father of the Cardiff Devils, and the "biggest" of all the retired jerseys at the club. Though diminutive in stature his charisma, drive and ability were the measure of anyone in the game and he used these to make the Devils the powerhouse of the Heineken era. On the ice and off he led the Devils, famously stepping out of retirement several times to help the team, and his legendary goal celebration of "shooting the clock" is the most iconic sight in Devils history.

Lawless was in charge when each of our retired jersey players were signed or developed, and his passion for junior development saw the likes of Nicky Chinn, Neil Francis, Stevie Lyle, and Jason Stone come through the ranks in Cardiff.

Jason Stone (#10 retired for the Devils):

"Stoney" graced the Devils for over two decades and leads all players with 1,167 appearances between 1988 and 2010. In his 22-year Devils career, Jason Stone's list of accolades include four leagues championships, three play-off titles and two Challenge Cup Trophies. In the inaugural season of the Super league, Stone was picked as the Best British Defenceman en route to the Devils' league title that same season. Like his name, Stoney was rock solid, dependable, and consistent. Not a flashy player, he nevertheless scored several big goals for the club and could play huge minutes when required.

Steve Moria (#19 retired for the Devils):

Mo was prolific throughout his entire career - which spanned an incredible 27 years as a professional – but it is his time in Cardiff that made the most impact, brought us the most success, and mean that just like Stoney's appearance record, Mo's scoring for the Devils will likely never be beaten.

His first season in Cardiff heralded the nightmares he would cause netminders for the next four years, as he posted an unbelievable 85 goals and 178 points in a mere 24 games. In his first four seasons with Cardiff, he amassed 655 points in 126 games, and he is the all-time leading scorer for Cardiff with 778 goals and 1,655 points.

Brad Voth (#26 retired for the Devils):

Voth's career spanned seven seasons for the Devils, from 2005 to 2012, but his impact on the club and around the Elite League remains. Every team, including the Devils, is always looking for that Vothlike player, a rare combination of heavy hitting, intimidation, toughness, and a scoring touch. He was the face of the franchise for his 7 years as a Devil and was probably the most feared and most talked about player in the league at that time. In 2007/08, his second year as captain of the Devils, he scored 30 goals, and racked up 328 minutes in penalties, leading his team in both categories. That isn't just a rarity in professional ice hockey, that is unheard of. The Devils' tough guy, maybe the toughest in the league back then, was also the Devils' top goal scorer. Many fans credit him as the reason they fell in love with the sport and with the Devils.

THREE STARS ON THE TEAM

Viktor Zakharov: Ukrainian forward born in 1994. He started his career in the HC Donbass system in the 2012/13 season. Zakharov has won six national titles with Donbass and he also won the title in Kazakhstan with Irtysh Pavlodar. Currently, he leads the team in games played, points and assists. Viktor Zakharov made his national team debut at the age of 19 and became the youngest captain in the history of the Ukrainian national team.

In the 2013/14 season, Viktor Zakharov inscribed his name in Ukrainian hockey history when he became the youngest Ukrainian to play in the KHL. At the time of his debut on 17 November 2013, Zakharov was aged 19 years and 313 days. He has won multiple medals at the IIHF World Championship for Ukraine's junior and senior teams.

Andrey Sigarev: Russian forward who joined Donbass in July 2020. Before joining the Donetsk club, he spent seven seasons in the KHL. In addition, the 28-yearold forward has extensive experience in the VHL and MHL. In the KHL, Sigarev wore the jerseys of SKA St. Petersburg, Admiral Vladivostok, Lokomotiv Yaroslavl and Sibir Novosibirsk.

In 2020/21, Sigarev was the Ukrainian Hockey League's top point scorer, top goal scorer, and he was also named as the league's top import. Last season, he also broke Donbass' record for goals scored in a single UHL season.

Mikhail Stefanovich: A Belarusian hockey icon. A graduate of Dynamo Minsk's junior system, Stefanovich began his professional career with Dynamo Minsk's farm team in the Belarusian Extraleague. In 2007, Stefanovich moved to the Quebec Remparts of the QMJHL, and he was drafted 98th overall by the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs in 2008.

After his spell in North America, Stefanovich moved to the KHL's Dynamo Minsk in 2010. He spent some time in the VHL before carving out a prolific career in the Belarusian topflight in the jerseys of HK Gomel, Neman Grodno and Yunost Minsk. Stefanovich is a five-time champion of Belarus, remarkably winning all five of these titles in consecutive seasons, and he was the league's top sniper and points scorer in 2018/19.

Stefanovich also has experience in the Champions Hockey League, dressing in a total of 15 matches for Neman Grodno and Yunost Minsk.

CLUB TRIVIA

During the team's participation in the KHL, hockey stars such as two-time Stanley Cup champion **Ruslan Fedotenko, Alexey** **Ponikarovsky, Anton Babchuk, Evgeny Dadonov, Sergey Varlamov** and many others with NHL experience played for Donbass.

In January 2013, Donbass Donetsk became the first and only Ukrainian club to win the prestigious IIHF Continental Cup. In the Superfinal, the games of which were played at the Donetsk Arena Druzhba from 11 to 13 January, the champion of Ukraine defeated Metallurg Zhlobin (Belarus), HC Bolzano (Italy), and Rouen Dragons (France), gaining all nine points.

Donbass also participates in various social and charitable projects. The club has implemented dozens of projects for Ukrainian school students and a number of programs aimed at supporting the youth of the Donbass region. Every year, representatives of Donbass Donetsk commemorate veterans of the Donetsk region on Victory Day, provide support to socially vulnerable citizens, talented students and gifted athletes, and also provide assistance to lonely old people, people with disabilities, veterans, and orphans.

Oleg Mikulchik was the head coach of Donbass-2 in the 2011/12 and 2012/13 seasons and won two national championships. Alexander was the team's strength coach from 2011 to 2014.

HC Donbass assistant coach **Igor Kugut** won two national titles as a defenceman for the club.
